

Can I bring a portable power bank from the UK



Overview

In the UK, as with most countries, power banks are treated as spare lithium-ion batteries, which means they must go in your hand luggage, not in your checked baggage. This is due to safety concerns—if a battery overheats or catches fire, it's much easier to deal with in the cabin. But when it comes to packing your tech for a flight, you might be asking yourself: can you take a power bank on an airplane?

The short answer is yes, you can, but there are a few important rules you need to know before you toss one in your bag. Can You Bring a Portable Charger on a Plane?

Yes, you. Some airlines allow larger capacity power banks (100-160Wh) with prior permission, while anything over 160Wh is completely banned. Here are the detailed regulations you need to know in advance: *Watt-Hour (Wh) Calculation: If your power bank's capacity is in milliamp-hours (mAh), you can convert it. All liquids must be put in a single, transparent, re-sealable plastic bag of up to 20 x 20cm (8 x 8in) with a total capacity of up to approximately 1 litre. With airline approval, you may carry up to two larger batteries (101-160 watt-hours or 2-8 grams). Always verify specific rules with your airline before.
